The lesson God teaches us here is that He provides for all our needs and we should try to help others who need help. Just as God shelters us from the weather and keeps us fed, we should try to help others who need help. We should also tell others about God's great love which He showed when He sent his Son Jesus to live and die to save us from our sins and provide a home for us in heaven. The Bible teaches us in Proverbs 22:9, "A generous man will himself be blessed for he shares his food with the poor." Jesus teaches us to love and help others in Matthew 25:34-36 when He says, "The King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me."
