What can we learn from God's creation of summer?

Jesus teaches us in John 8:31, 36, 'ff you hold to my teaching you are really my disciples. Then you will know the truth and the truth will set you free ... So if the Son (Jesus) sets you free you will be free indeed."

When we are free to move around in summer we can learn the lesson of telling others about Jesus. We often make new friends in summer as we go out to play. Jesus told us that we should go out into the world to tell everyone about Him and what He has done for all of us. Jesus teaches us about telling others in Mark 16:15 when he said, "Go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved."
