Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is – his good, pleasing and perfect will.

The devil has laid out a pattern according to which he would have people tailor their deeds and desires. He laid out a pattern for Eve in the Garden of Eden and he succeeded in his effort. It was the pattern to disregard the will of God, and then to design and arouse a desire for the forbidden fruit.

The Old Testament is filled with examples to show the disastrous results of following this pattern. Thus, in the days of Noah, the sons of God consorted with the daughters of the world who were fair to look upon. They
