There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven: a time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant and a time to uproot . . .

In this day and age when so much is being said and written in favor of euthanasia and justified suicide, it may seem as though the issues of life and death are no longer in the hands of God. In the midst of our planned and controlled economy it may seem as though we have reached a point where is completely left to the wisdom of man to decide the welfare of mankind. However wise and shrewd people may think themselves to be in these and other matters, the truth will still stand that when God wants a child to be born it will be born, and when God sets a limit to a person's life and decides it is to come to an end, it will come to an end at the divinely appointed time.
