Beaver



The beaver lives in rivers and ponds near woodland. They are excellent swimmers and can stay underwater for up to fifteen minutes. They have a large flat tail which helps them to swim and build their homes. Beavers will alert other beavers when they see danger by slapping their tails on the water which makes a loud noise.
