What can we learn from the dog?

The dog teaches us about loyalty, forgiveness and love. The dog also teaches us that we are all the same family in God's sight not matter who we are or what we look like.

Dogs are loyal. A dog will give its life to protect its loved ones. Even a dog that is not treated well will often be very loyal to its owners. We should learn the lesson of loyalty from the dog. When many people deserted Jesus He asked the apostles if they also wanted to leave. They chose to remain loyal as we read in John 6:66, "From this time many of his disciples turned back and no longer followed him. 'You do not want to leave too do you?' Jesus asked the twelve. Simon Peter answered him, 'Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We believe and know that you are the Holy One of God." The apostles were richly rewarded for their loyalty, not in money or fame but in the love of God.

Another show of great loyalty is seen in Thomas who was one of the apostles. Thomas knew Jesus was in great danger but was willing to stay

with Him and die with Him if necessary. We read in John 11:16, "Then Thomas (called Didymus) said to the rest of the disciples, 'Let us also go that we may die with him (Jesus)."

The Bible teaches us that God was willing to forgive us and love us even when we did not deserve such mercy. We read in Romans 5:8, "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners. Christ died for us." We also read in Colossians 3:12, "As God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. Bear with each other and forgive whatever grievances you may have against one another. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues put on love which binds them all together in perfect unity."

All dogs come from one source: the two dogs on Noah's ark and they see each other as equals, we should also treat others as equals. No matter who we are, where we come from or what we look like, God sees us all as His children thanks to the
